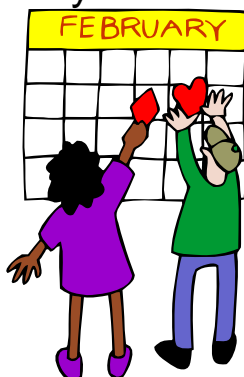

Interview of Virginia Remington by Nancy Guerrette

Virginia was born in the United States in Providence Rhode Island in 1927. She was the only girl and had six brothers. Her father drove taxis. Her father tried to get any job he could because the U.S. was in a depression. Virginia attended Clamston High School. When she graduated, she felt fortunate to land a job with Narragansett Electric Company in customer service. She worked there for twelve years. She met Norman Remington who also worked at the electric company and they were married in 1947. After their marriage Virginia and Norman decided to remain in Rhode Island to live and were blessed with the birth of one daughter. They remained married for fifty two years. In the year 1957 they decided to move south. They moved to Ft. Lauderdale where Virginia still resides.

Jobs here were scarce and far and few in between, however, Norman was lucky to get a job with the U.S. Post Office as a letter carrier. Virginia also managed to obtain a job with the State of Florida in the Unemployment Compensation sector. She was the Manager of Job Services, loved her job, and remained there for a total of thirty years.

Virginia is now legally blind and walks with a special cane. A device on the bottom of the cane tells her if she is hitting something. She loves walking and socializing. She can watch some TV if she is up close to the screen. She suffers with macular detachment; the Doctor does use laser treatment to remove blood from the retina. She also has cataracts but she and her Doctor have agreed not to have them removed because her Doctor does not think it will improve her vision.

Virginia has been coming to the Focal Point for about three years. She usually comes three days per week. She enjoys it very much and likes the people she has met here. She tried other Senior Centers closer to Ft. Lauderdale but found Focal Point to be the best. She really praises all the dedicated employees and volunteers who are at Focal Point. She plays Bingo with the larger letter cards; she loves the food program and sometime goes to support groups. She believes coming to Focal Point has improved the quality of her life.

The Nurse's Spotlight



AMERICAN HEART MONTH

With the increasing incidence and dangers of hypertension, there is a need for regular blood pressure monitoring. Blood pressure is recorded as a fraction with the systolic reading (top number) recorded over the diastolic (bottom number). Everyone's blood pressure rises and falls many times throughout the day as well as from one day to the next. The fluctuations are in response to what you are doing or how you feel. Blood pressure increases when you are anxious, upset or afraid and decreases after the stressful situation is over. Increases also occur when you exercise or eat a big meal and decreases after resting.

When checking your Blood Pressure the numbers are a measurement of the pressure inside the arteries caused by the flow of blood from the heart. When the heart contracts (a heart beat) blood is pumped into the arteries causing the pressure to reach a peak. This is called the "systolic" blood pressure. A normal healthy systolic pressure is lower than 140. Between the beats when the heart is relaxed, the pressure drops to a lower level and this is called the "diastolic" blood pressure. Most individuals will have different blood pressure readings from left arm to right arm by about 10 degrees. For this reason it is advisable to monitor blood pressure readings in both arms. The arm with the higher blood pressure reading should be recorded and indicating which arm it was taken on. The subsequent readings should always be recorded on that arm.
